Calligraphy - Shoho Teramoto

Wednesday 31st July

Teramoto san is a certified Master of Calligraphy and has a Masters from Fukuoka University. She has a number of Artist residencies as well as publications in Kindred Spirit magazine and Kyodo TV, and received awards for her work at the Tokyo Wonder Wall Art Exhibition amongst others. She has exhibited in Heals, London, the Yomiuri Calligraphy Exhibition and Fukuoka Art Society.

Studied with a top calligraphy artist ShinzanKamijyo. Internationally exhibited Japanese artist and educator with a wide multicultural background and Zen-influenced aesthetic of clarity, simplicity and spirituality. Research interests within social & cultural issues include contemporary art, women artists & informal education: she has resided and presented her research in 3 continents. She is currently Voluntary Executive Secretary of World Traditional Karate Do Federation (W.T.K.F) for producing handwritten diploma.

<u> Manga – Chie Kutsuwada</u>

Wednesday 24th July

Chie Kutsuwada is a professional manga artist who attends regular manga-related events and runs manga workshops at various institutions around UK such as British Museum and Victoria & Albert Museum. She usually creates her own original stories as well as illustrations like King of a Miniature Garden (2007), her first manga, and also produces artwork for Shakespeare's As You Like It (SelfMadeHero), Hagakure (Kodansha) and others.

<u> Manga – Cristina Fabian</u>

Wednesday 14th August

Cristina, Italian, won twice the Disney drawing competition when she was only 6 years old, published her first manga in a local newspaper in Pistoia, Italy, TV interviewer for the program of anime and manga, in her city, published her first manga series in France with Yoko magazine. Travelled to Japan several times, and has auto-published her first light novel about Japanese secret agents, in London.

Sushi Classes – Dionisio Reyes and Junji Aida

Dionsio has been the Head Sushi Chef at Moshi Moshi since 1996, and worked under Japanese top sushi masters in his native country the Philippines. He is a master in the art of fish cutting, and has been out on the fishing boats with our Cornish fisherman, encouraging him not to throw away the precious liver of the monkfish, and use hitherto low –value fish such as wrasse and dog fish. Junji is a sushi master and has extensive experience in Japan and London working under some of Japan's leading sushi masters. He enjoys the theatre of sushi, and his classes are always fun and interactive.

<u>Soroban - Noboyuki Fujioka</u>

Mondays 22nd & 29th July, 5th August

Nobuyuki Fujioka, a father of two originally from Japan, has run his unique <u>Abacus x</u> <u>Maths Learning Course</u> in the UK since 2010, which combines the Japanese abacus and its application to school maths. Nobuyuki has a Masters Degree from the University of Sussex, and was also educated at universities in the US and France. He is a member of International Soroban Diffusion Foundation, and occasionally travels back to Japan for further research and training on the soroban abacus.

<u>Soroban – Kimie Markarian</u>

Mondays 12th & 19th Tuesday 27th August

Kimie has taught Soroban to children in her local neighbourhood and schools since she arrived in the UK from Japan. She believes that Soroban helps the understanding of our number system; base ten. After her pupils appearing on Blue Peter and performing their extraordinary mental calculations through seeing the images of the Soroban beads, Kimie was asked to teach on the Continent. She acquired Further and Adult Education, City & Guilds certificate.

General Booking Advice

Abacus soroban

The teachers recommend that you attend at least 3 of the classes in order to be able to grasp the potential for using the abacus. You will of course gain some insight to using it in just one class, but in order for it to sink in and for students to be able to 'visualise' arithmetic through the soroban, it will take more time than just the one session. Please bring your own abacus, and make sure that it is a Japanese one, and not a Chinese one (the Japanese soroban abacus have 1 bead on the top line and 4 on the bottom, whereas the Chinese abacus have 2 beads on the top line and 5 on the bottom) If you don't have your own abacus, you can purchase an abacus from us for £14 if you prefer. Text Books cost £1 and last the entire course.
